SOUTHERN NEVADA AREA COMMUNICATIONS COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES DECEMBER 17, 2014

The Southern Nevada Area Communications Council (SNACC) held its monthly meeting in the Mead 3 Conference Room, Las Vegas Valley Water District, on December 17, 2014, at 10:00 a.m. Board members present were Jerry Keating, Lou Amell, Jeff Lytle, Dane Mattoon, Ed Babauta, Frank Milligan and Brian Nebeker.

<u>COMMENTS BY THE GENERAL PUBLIC</u>: George Molnar, Statewide Interoperability Coordinator, announced the State of Nevada will hold a public meeting for the initial consultation with FirstNet in Carson City on January 7, 2015 at 8:30am with a video teleconference to Southern Nevada.

- 1. FOR POSSIBLE ACTION: Approve agenda with the inclusion of tables and/or reconsidered items, emergency items, and approve the minutes of the November 19, 2014 meeting: Item #4 was pulled from the agenda. Chairman Keating publicly announced his appreciation to all for their due diligence and efforts in getting the Motorola contract approved and discussed issues that arose with the State Board of Taxation. The agenda for December 17, 2014 and the minutes from the SNACC meeting held on November 19, 2014 were unanimously approved.
- **2.** <u>FOR POSSIBLE ACTION:</u> <u>Election of a new Chairman and Vice Chairman:</u> Nominations were made to re-elect Jerry Keating as Chairman and Lou Amell as Vice Chairman. Both were unanimously approved.

- 4. FOR DISCUSSION/ACTION: Administrator's Evaluation: Item #4 was pulled from agenda.
- 5. <u>FOR DISCUSSION: Status and/or update on the Motorola P25 contract</u>: The contract was signed by the Board on December 1, 2014. Jeff Share, Clark County Budget Manager, discussed the communication issues with the Board and the County regarding the State Board of Taxation requirements. Failure to obtain approval prior to signing the contract resulted in the County receiving a violation of NRS.350.089. Administrator Goss has been tasked to provide Clark County Finance within the next two weeks all pertinent data for the process of how the Motorola Contract was obtained.
- **6.** FOR DISCUSSION: Receive a report from the Nevada Public Safety Communications Committee from SNACC's representative member: Vice Chair Amell shared that a Grants Subcommittee will be formed and that the next generation 9-1-1 could have an impact on dispatch centers. The next meeting will be January 7 with FirstNet.

Fiscal Impact:

Future fund balances as calculated in the P25 migration scenario were not dependent on this buy-in revenue. Buy-in revenue will accumulate in fund balance and may be used for future capital replacement.

Background:

The Southern Nevada Area Communications Council buy-in fee is currently \$1460. This fee was set in 2004 initially for the infrastructure to build out the SNACC radio system.

SNACC Buy-in Rate

In 2004, SNACC set its buy-in rate to \$1460.00 to coincide with the COPS Grant, which provided approximately 1500 radios to the fire departments in the Las Vegas Valley. This also allowed SNACC to get special pricing for an additional 1500 radios. This buy-in allowed SNACC to expand the system which increased coverage and provided additional capacity for the users.

Since this rate has been in effect it has allowed the SNACC system to grow to 7 Simulcast sites in the valley and 11 remote sites in both Clark and Nye County. SNACC has approximately 10,000 subscriber units and 8 dispatch centers on the system at this time.

With the contract approval for the new P25 upgrade to the SNACC system, all upgrades are included in the lease used to move forward to the P25 platform. This will allow SNACC to lower the new unit buy-in rate to a suggested \$500.00 dollar per unit rate, which will potentially add more users, grow the system, and provide improved interoperability between agencies.

Many agencies have not joined SNACC due to the present buy-in rate and have expressed interest in joining, if the rates were more affordable. Existing customers have also been hesitant to add to their existing fleet of radios because of the current buy-in fee.

The suggested buy-in is in line with many government systems in the western United States.

In summary, if SNACC lowers its buy-in rate, it could increase its user base, thus increasing interoperations between many governmental agencies.

P25 and Console Upgrade Project

- > Motorola and SNACC have started performing site walks at customer console locations, which includes the R-56 reviews of each facility.
- > Simultaneously In the first week of March:
 - Console presentations will be made to each agency.
 - Radio or RF site walks will be conducted.
- > This project has been fast tracked by Motorola due to the availability of the Version 7.14 Upgrade team. This upgrade will be taking place from March 5th 2015 thru May 15th 2015.
- ➤ With the upgrade to 7.14 Genesis equipment will need to be replaced and will have quotes and pricing from Genesis at the next SNACC Board meeting.

System Issues

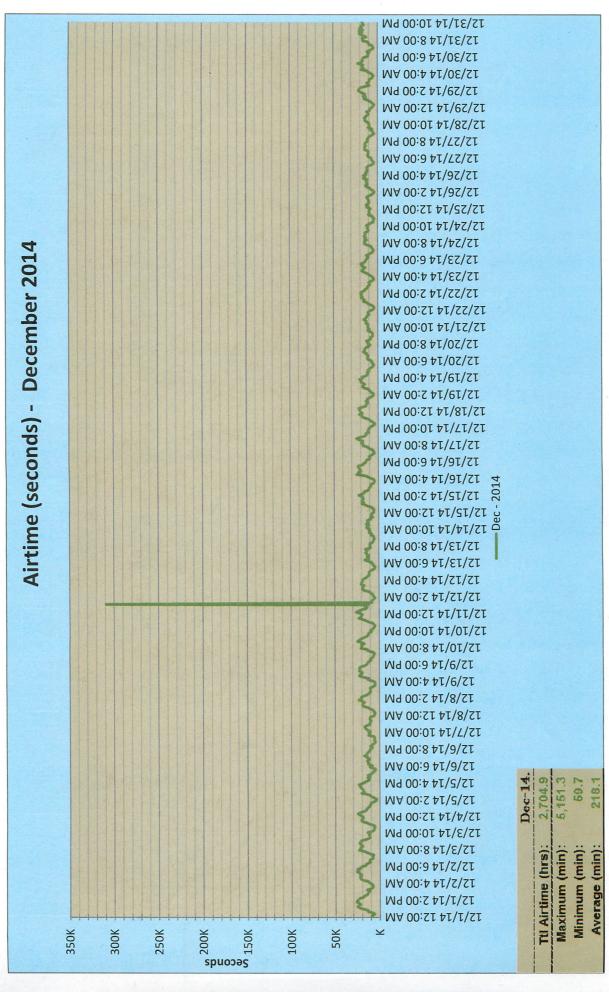
- > In Astro Digital Mode some interference has been noticed in the Centennial Hospital area. We have been unable to locate source at this time.

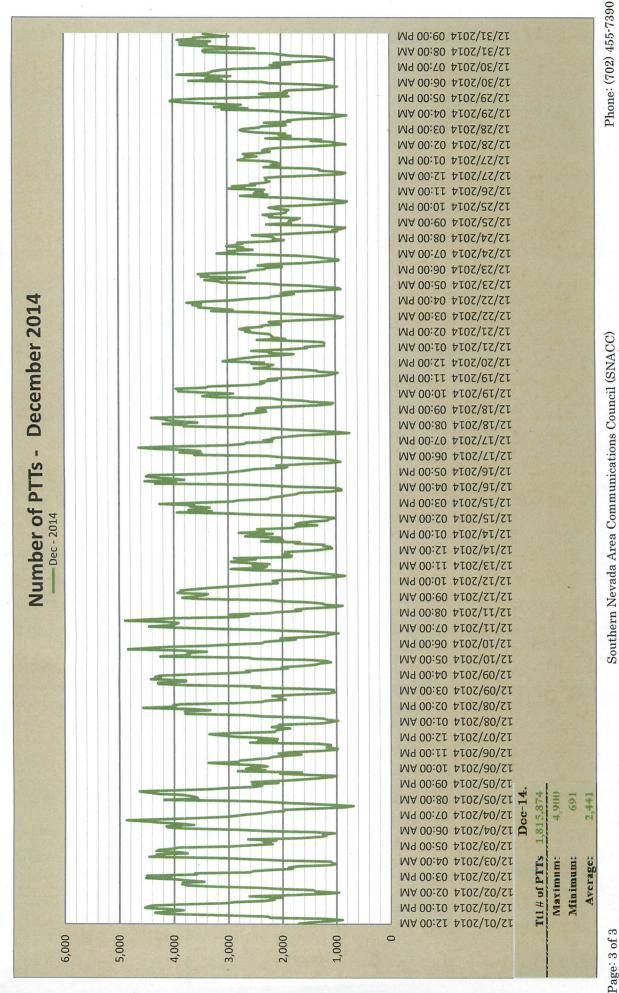
Detailed Busies - Monthly Report

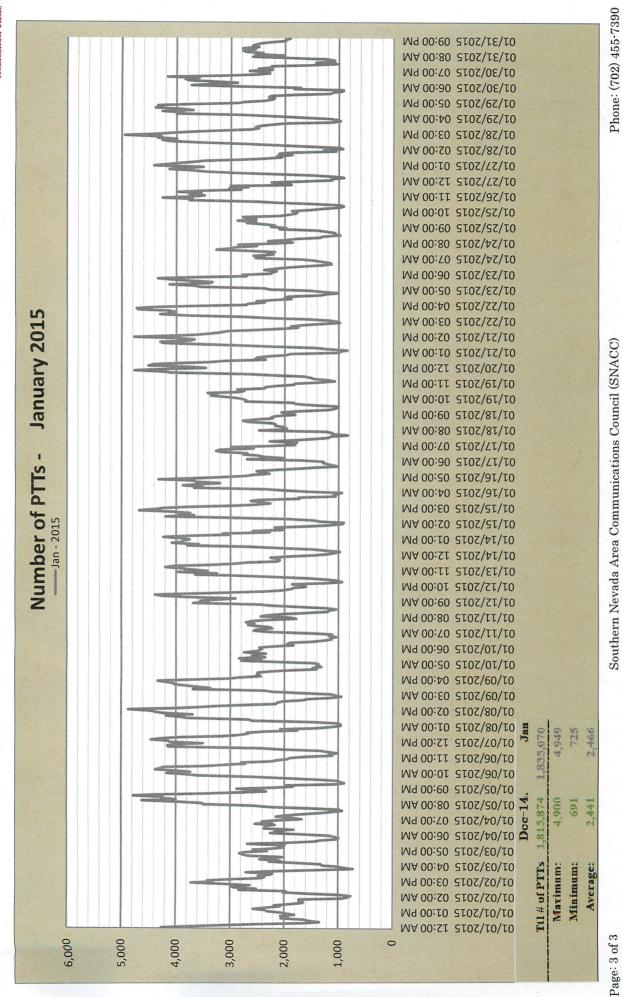
